## The Line

From a Christian perspective, what is there to be known? How is it known?

## The Cave

- 1. What would the church and Plato say respectively concerning the "darkness" that beclouds and imprisons people?
- 2. Is knowledge of the highest a natural possibility for Plato? for Christians?
- 3. Does Plato's notion that the happiness of the state takes precedence over the happiness of individuals foster totalitarianism?

Does modernity's notion that the happiness of the individual takes precedence over the happiness of the state foster social disintegration?

4. What understanding of the human condition does Plato presuppose when he says that in states not governed by philosopher-kings people fight one another over shadows and are distracted by the struggle for power?
